Burr oaks produce acorns!

The Burr Oak can grow up to 100 feet but in rare cases can become as tall as 120 feet

For industrial purposes, Burr Oak is used for cabinetry and hard wood flooring!

The flowers of the Burr Oak are greenish-yellow and referred to as catkins.

Burr Oak trees are extremely resistant to wildfires due to the thick and ridged bark on the trunk and branches.

The leaves of a Burr Oak are about 4-10 inches long with large wavy teeth

The acorns on the Burr Oak are very appetizing to squirrels, deer, blue jays and cows!
